HORSESHOE BEND TRANSFER STATION
OFFICIAL MEETING MINUTES

In attendance: Chairman Alan Ward, Commissioner Laura Baker, Solid Waste Superintendent Mike Bottoms, Miller Enterprise – Roger Miller, Solid Waste Paul Rekow, Solid Waste Kari Allred.

Chairman Ward called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

All parties in attendance did a walk-through of the Horseshoe Bend Transfer Station.

The Solid Waste Department will discuss and address any necessary modifications to the trailer loading area below the tipping floor for Miller Enterprise trucks. Mr. Miller will follow up on how the current layout works after a trial period.

The collection of Waste Oil was discussed. The used oil will be poured into a collection tank if not contaminated; the Road and Bridge department will be called to empty the tank when full. Any contaminated oil containers will be placed on a containment pallet.

A discussion of putting in a landline at the Transfer Station was had for the purpose of being able to accept credit cards as well as possibly put in a cash register.

A discussion ensued on whether the Horseshoe Bend Transfer Station should take concrete or not, and who would dispose of the concrete. A decision was made to leave the status as is at the Transfer Station, of accepting concrete in small quantities that is then packed into trucks, hauled to Idaho Waste Systems along with a possible Resolution to re-set the fee. Large quantities are to be delivered to the Garden Valley Solid Waste Site for disposal.

Open site off hours for contractors and fees were discussed. Solid Waste fees are set by a Boise County Resolution; a further discussion will be had with Mr. Miller before a Resolution will be drawn up.

Clear River Recycling, who collects computers and monitors was discussed and Mr. Miller will let the Solid Waste Department know if he will be keeping a recycling bin on site. The Boise Bike Project was also discussed and decided that at Miller Enterprises discretion the bicycles will be recycled.

A brush pile will be burned once a year during the winter months, with all appropriate agencies notified beforehand, and this will be done by the Solid Waste Department. Any and all grass clippings will be piled and composted.

Mr. Miller was given the state statute on covered and non-covered loads. Under the Covered Load Ordinance the Solid Waste Department can charge a \$5.00 fee for all loads that are not covered. It was also suggested that Miller Enterprises submit a reconciliation on a quarterly basis for fuel recovery.

The keys along with a \$50.00 bank will be collected from Idaho Waste Systems on Thursday, October 16th, 2015 and will be delivered to Miller Enterprises.
