A BOISE COUNTY RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE DRUG AND ALCOHOL POLICY FOR EAST BOISE COUNTY AMBULANCE DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Boise County Board of Commissioners are authorized to create, operate and maintain an ambulance district where none exists per Idaho Code 31-3901; and

WHEREAS, the Boise County Board of Commissioners created the East Boise County Ambulance District by approval of Resolution #1988-07, Formation of East Boise County Ambulance District dated October 17, 1988; and

WHEREAS, East Boise County Ambulance District serves the emergency medical needs of residents and visitors on the east side of Boise County to include the cities of Idaho City, Lowman, Centerville and Placerville as well as to the subdivisions and homes located along the SH-21 corridor; and

WHEREAS, the Boise County Board of Commissioners has a responsibility to ensure a safe working environment for all EBCAD personnel and East Boise County residents and visitors; and

WHEREAS, the Boise County Personnel Policy states that all Boise County employees shall be drug and alcohol free while on-duty.




BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all EBCAD volunteers shall be governed by and will adhere to this drug and alcohol use and testing policy.
