

The Commission agreed that the goal of going on the air would be to inform the public of what the UDO is and why the public should care. Commissioner Anderson joined the discussion and agreed that staff could prepare the fact sheet to have available at the "open houses". Commissioner Anderson suggested that she discuss with the full Board of County Commissioners the possibility of having a professional facilitator meet with the work group and provide direction for the open houses. Ways of getting a draft copy of the UDO to the public was discussed, as well as where to put notices of the open houses and public hearings, comment sheets, handouts, etc. The Commission discussed the timeline, but no decision was made at that time.

Having no further business, with unanimous consent, Chair Tain adjourned the special meeting at 11:38 a.m. and opened the UDO joint workshop.


Commissioner Anderson stated for the record there was not a quorum of the Board of County Commissioners.

Chair Tain stated the work group would continue with the review of the draft UDO beginning on page 95. The work group proceeded with making changes; which were documented by Ms. Canody. The work group reviewed the draft Burn Ban ordinance sent to Ms. Canody by Emergency Manager John Roberts. Ms. Canody will email a copy out to the work group.

The work group agreed to schedule two more meetings: 1) Thursday, April 3rd at the Public Safety Building starting at 10:00 a.m.; and 2) Monday, April 7th at the Horseshoe Bend City Hall, if available, or the Horseshoe Bend Courthouse, starting at 10:00 a.m. Ms. Canody will confirm the availability of the sites, prepare the notices and email the joint work group with the final locations.

Having no further business, the Commission special meeting/joint workshop was adjourned at 3:55 p.m. by unanimous consent.
