OFFICIAL MEETING MINUTES

IN ATTENDANCE: Chairman Ward, Commissioner Jackson, Clerk Prisco, Deputy Clerk Coffelt, Assessor Juszcak, PA Maloney, P&Z Administrator Canody, Emergency Management Coordinator Roberts, Community Justice Supervisor Leader, Treasurer Hutchings, Deputy Clerk Loya (Elections), Sheriff Roeber.

ABSENT: Commissioner Baker

ALSO PRESENT: Trevor Howard – LHTAC.

Chairman Ward called the meeting to order and the pledge of allegiance was recited.

AMENDMENTS TO THE AGENDA: None.

CONSTITUENT INPUT: Mr. Trevor Howard gave the Board a brief update on the Crouch Bridge Project. Traffic will be minimized to one lane for paving. Mr. Howard has also estimated that the entire project will be completed under budget.

MINUTES: Commissioner Jackson MOTIONED to approve the minutes from Tuesday March 29th, 2016 as amended. Chairman Ward SECONDED, Chairman Ward-Aye; Commissioner Jackson-Aye, motion carries.

DEPARTMENTAL ISSUES: Planning & Zoning Administrator Canody discussed with the Board the possibility of increasing the current Building Permit Fees, along with documentation that she presented. Deputy Clerk Loya (Elections) gave a brief update to the Board on the department and would like the Boards input on some new items that are being researched. Assessor Juszcak spoke to the Board concerning a payroll addition for his department. Chairman Ward MOTIONED to approve the payroll addition per request of Assessor Juszcak of the Assessor's office. Commissioner Jackson SECONDED; Chairman Ward-Aye; Commissioner Jackson-Aye, motion carries. A brief discussion ensued concerning the applicants for the Desktop Support Technician position. Clerk Prisco spoke to the Board about a conversation that she had with two partners from Bailey & Company last Thursday. Clerk Prisco had forwarded a copy of the front page of the Idaho World which ran last Wednesday (March 30th edition). Ms. Cassie Zattiero, one of the partners, informed Clerk Prisco that Eileen Capson had contacted her and identified herself as a "constituent" of Boise County, not as a reporter, which Clerk Prisco finds unethical and problematic. Bailey & Company does not receive the Idaho World and they were unaware of who Ms. Capson represented. Ms. Zattiero and Mr. Leroy Loomis have told Clerk Prisco that they will no longer comment over the phone to constituents of Boise County. The caller(s) will be referred to the appropriate department of the county. Clerk Prisco also received notification yesterday on the SRS distribution, which was received this morning. The total County amount is \$1,038,890.00, of that the school district portion is \$311,667.01, which is 30% of the total. The amount that will go to the Road Department will be a little over \$727,000. Sheriff Roeber gave a brief update on the security locks on the county buildings to the Board.
