

RESOLUTION #96-7

WHEREAS, the Boise County Board of Commissioners recognizes the serious need for more adequate office space and prisoners holding facilities in relation to the Sheriff's Department; and

WHEREAS, the cost of transport and housing of Boise County prisoners is becoming greater and greater as time goes, with in excess of fifty percent (50%) of these costs incurred by prisoners for holding time of 72 hours or less; and

WHEREAS, neither Canyon County nor Ada County are interested in continued acceptance of Boise County prisoners; and

WHEREAS, in excess of fifty percent (50%) of the funds budgeted to house prisoners could be reallocated to assist in payment for facilities within Boise County for up to a 72 hour hold; and


WHEREAS, the Building Needs Assessment Committee appointed by the Boise County Board of Commissioners has come before the Board with the recommendation that Boise County enter an agreement with Olson and Associates Architects, Inc. for a two (2) to five (5) year lease with an option to buy, the building that is located on Highway 21 in Idaho City, Idaho, better known as "the old forest service building."

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Boise County Board of Commissioners shall enter such agreement for purposes of addressing the needs of the Sheriff's Department. Details of said agreement shall be spelled out on the face of the lease document.


