WHEREAS, it is a well documented and scientific fact that the grizzly is an uncontrollable and deadly threat to man; and


WHEREAS, certain agencies of the Federal Government may attempt to establish a population of Grizzly Bear in Boise County; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Boise County have petitioned the Commissioners of Boise County, State of Idaho, asking for protection; and


NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Boise County Commissioners, Idaho as follows:

That the Fish and Wildlife Service or any other group or entity is in violation of Boise County Ordinance No. 98-5 (The Unacceptable Species Ordinance) in their attempt to introduce or reintroduce the Grizzly Bear into Boise County. Therefore, in order to perform our duty as Commissioners and protect our Citizens we are left with the unenviable and sad task of having to take drastic action, that of Grizzly Bear eradication or removal by any means possible should any Grizzly enter Boise County.


